

We were all very saddened to hear the devastating news of the passing of Bob Fulton, AO this week.

Many of us, whether we are Sea Eagles fans or not, will remember the incredible contribution made by Bob Fulton to the Sea Eagles and the game of Rugby League itself. His contribution and influence as both a player and a coach will be forever remembered by young and old, players and spectators and all those in the Rugby League and sporting world.

He was highly regarded not just for his technical and physical ability but his incredible work ethic and passion for the game of Rugby League. He was able to bring out the best in those around him on and off the field and earned the respect of many in the game. He also instilled that passion and skill he was so famous for in so many others. The following statistics highlight his achievements –

Premierships – Manly 1972-73, 1976

Australia – 35 Tests, 7 Tests as a captain

NSWRL player of the year – 1973-74

Grand Final man of the match – 1973

Named as one of rugby league's first four Immortals – 1981

Australian Rugby League team of the century – 2008

NSW team of the century – 2008

NSW Country team of the century – 2008

Named in NRL team of the 1960s – 2006

Named in NRL team of the 1970s – 2005

First class games – 428, 259 tries, 961 points

As further testament to his contribution, he was inducted into the Sport Australia Hall of Fame and the Rugby League Hall of Fame, received the Australian Sports Medal and received an Order of Australia for his services to Rugby League Football. As we read the many tributes being paid to him, I don't believe his full contribution to the game can ever be measured in just sporting achievements or awards as he influenced so many and the game of Rugby League will always be better for it.

As a local community, we will grieve the great loss of a true gentleman, an incredible sportsman and a Sea Eagles legend and I have no doubt this loss will be felt right across the country.

BACKGROUND

Sadly yesterday we learned of the passing of Col Crawford, OAM who will always be remembered as one of the most significant and highly esteemed members of our community.

Col was not only an incredibly successful businessman, he was extremely generous and a huge supporter of many charities and institutions on the northern beaches. As testament to his generosity he was awarded an Order of Australia Medal in 1997 having raised millions of dollars for the Cerebral Palsy Alliance along with his work with Rotary International and support for local sporting clubs including the Warringah Rugby Club. This highly-valued support continues to this day through Col Crawford Motors.

I was fortunate to meet Col at charity events and he never failed to brighten a room. He was an extraordinary person who had such a positive attitude for everything and everyone and provided inspiration for many. He was incredibly proud of his family and his legacy will continue to succeed under the stewardship of his son and grandsons. His story is really quite inspirational. He began back in 1967 with a block of land in Brookvale and was only able to afford 3 cars as stock – it is quite incredible to imagine given Col Crawford is now one of Australia's largest multi franchised car dealerships.

A memorable moment for Col and many in our community was when he was selected to carry the Olympic torch along streets in Collaroy Plateau where he resided for many years. Those who were present, and I believe there were hundreds, were there to share this incredible moment with one of our community's popular and loved members.

I believe Col summed himself up most aptly back in 2017 when he said "life is what you make it. I love life, I love people and I love my staff". He was a true gentleman with a generous spirit and made an outstanding contribution to our community.
